We are members of the African Diaspora, particularly the Ethiopian diaspora community, who espouse the positive changes that are taking place in Ethiopia under the leadership of the Ethiopian People's Revolutionary Democratic Front (EPRDF), the duly elected and current governing party in Ethiopia

We are writing to you to voice our disappointment at your sponsorship of and planned participation in a conference aimed at derailing the on-going socio-economic developments and democratization in Ethiopia.

We are aware and greatly appreciate Africa Action's past struggle to end colonization and unrelenting Defiance Campaign to end inhumane apartheid in South Africa. We commend Africa Action's current purpose to realize political, economic and social justice for peace and development in Africa and its ongoing concerted effort to influence a positive US foreign policy towards Africa.

We share your mission of enhancing good governance in the continent of Africa and share your determination. We believe that the present day Ethiopia is a shining example of what your organization aims to achieve in Africa. Reputable financial institutions attest to the fact that Ethiopia's economy is growing at exceptionally high rate for a non-oil producing country. In Ethiopia today infrastructure is being built to provide universal healthcare coverage and to make elementary, secondary and tertiary education widely available. And most importantly Ethiopia is getting ready for the fourth national election to be held May 23, 2010 in which over sixty political parties are engaging in televised debates and vying for high level Federal and Local political positions all over the country

Therefore, it is in light of this reality in Ethiopia-an African success story-that a group of people who advocate violence and insurrection to acquire political and economic power have organized a conference deceptively titled "Ethiopia and the Horn of Africa: Conference on Governance, Peace, Security, and Development."
